Story Genres

SACRED STORIES

A Sacred Story is one in which God has the primary role. The people of God meet God in in Creation, with the patriarchs, in the Exodus, at Sinai, in the Temple, in the Prophets' visions, by encountering Jesus, and in other ways.

LITURGICAL

Liturgy means literally, "the work of the people." Liturgy helps express inner and outer existential realities in a way that others can participate in.

PARABLES

A parable is a kind of metaphor that uses short narrative fiction to reference a transcendent symbol, which in the Gospels is generally the Kingdom of heaven or Jesus. The materials are generally flat to keep them more "open" than the three-dimensional materials used for the Sacred Stories.


SILCENCE

examples.





THE GOAL OF GODLY PLAY

The goal of Godly Play is for children to move through the spiral curriculum during early, middle, and late childhood in such a way that they will enter adolescence with an inner working model of the classical Christian language system to root them deeply in the tradition and at the same time allow them to be open to the future.

What could you schedule outside of Sunday morning Godly Play that would extend and enrich experiences of your children and guides? How can you incorporate the language and practices of Godly Play into other parts of your program?

Is there a plan for at least one Sunday of orientation?


