Practice faith in daily life, equipping parishioners to embrace discipleship and personal growth in relationship with God.


Strengthen the bonds of our intergenerational community by emphasizing fellowship in our ministries, programs, and parish life.



THE MINISTRY

St. Columba's is seeking an experienced full-time lay Director of Children's Ministries (DCM). This individual will serve as pastor, teacher, evangelist, and administrator who works collegially with staff and parishioners to share the love of Christ, and to develop and implement offerings and programs that serve the overall mission of the church.

- Parent involved faith formation
 - Baptism Classes
 - Coming to Communion
- Music Programs
 - Handbells
 - Children's choir









St. Columba's children's ministry shares space with their nursery school and uses individual classrooms for Sunday school classes. The playground is used by the church, the nursery school, and the whole community. It attracts neighbors and parishioners and is named as one of St. Columba's great assets!

Director of Children's Ministries Role

- Oversee the Sunday school program, childcare, and liturgy opportunities for infants to 5th grade.
- Work collaboratively with the formation staff to develop and implement a comprehensive and cohesive Christian formation plan.
- Facilitate a vision for the children's ministry working with the formation ministry staff and key volunteers to create a mission, and core values for the children's ministry, as well as create three-year goals in alignment with the mission, vision, and values of the broader church.



Director of Children's Ministries Role

- Discern, recruit, and equip adult leaders annually and provide leader trainings and ongoing support.
- Serve as an ambassador to the community, building relationships with and facilitating opportunities for children and their families to build community.
- Ensure all systems and processes are in place and well functioning.
- Maintain and manage all modes of communication for children's ministries, including weekly email updates.
- Work closely with Children's Council to implement the vision of the children's program




KEY QUALIFICATIONS
